Task #1: Setting SMART Goals

What is a SMART Goal? SMART Goals are: Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Timely. A correctly written SMART goal answers the following questions: What specific things will you accomplish? How will you know when you have achieved this goal? Is this goal realistic / do you have the tools you need to achieve it? Why is this goal important in your life? When can you achieve this goal?

Example of a Career SMART Goal:

By August 2016, I will be employed as a High School Counselor. I will know that I have achieved this goal when I have my contract in hand and begin my first year as a High School Counselor. In order to achieve this goal, I must have a master's degree, positive letters of recommendation from my Graduate School Professors, and the drive to submit all of the necessary job applications to secure a position – all things I have! This goal is important to me because my School Counselor made an impact in my life and I aspire to have a career in which I can do the same for my student.

Task #2: Complete the Learning Style Inventory





Task #3: Begin Making a Resume


Why do you need a resume and what do you use it for? Resumes are meant to be used for a variety of contexts, such as applying to college or applying for jobs and internships. The important thing about a resume is that you have two versions: a master copy that lists *everything* you have ever done and a personalized copy that you make for each individual submission (job application, internship, college, etc.) that you are making. If a job calls for specific skills, you would only include the items from your Master resume that are relevant to that position. Some important categories on a resume include: contact information, education, experience (volunteer and work), and skills.

How to Add to Your Resume on Naviance


1. Once you log into Naviance, click "About Me" on the top right



2. Then click "My Stuff" from the Drop-Down Menu



3. Next, click "Resume." On that next screen, you will notice a red plus sign on the right. Click that to add an entry on your resume.



- 4. Go through each category and add all pertinent information. Since you are in high school, it would be acceptable to include both middle school and high school activities. Elementary school activities would now be considered outdated. Once you move on to college, only high school activities would be relevant, and so on.
 - a. On each section, make sure to answer all of the questions and click "Add" at the bottom to ensure that it is saved to your resume.
 - b. The goal would be to use Naviance to add any accomplishments you achieve (awards, job experiences, service organizations, etc.) and when it is time to actually create a Resume, you can find a nifty looking template through Google and add in all of the relevant entries.

- 5. At a minimum, students are required to add the following:
 - a. Objective: in this section, you can write in your Academic and Personal/Social SMART goals from Task #1 (and feel free to write a new SMART goal for Career if you haven't already)
 - b. Education (list your Elementary, Middle, and High Schools)
 - c. References (you should list at least two people who would be willing to write you a letter of recommendation or give a positive reference if a job/internship were to call them – these people can not be family members)

If you are able to, it would be good to add information in every possible section that you can, but the three sections above are mandatory to get credit for this Task.

Task #4: Complete the "Do What You Are" Assessment





Task #5: Road Trip Nation Videos and Reflection





How to Get to the Road Trip Nation Reflection Survey



Task #6: Multiple Intelligence Assessment




